Population health annual report

Stronger Partnerships, Healthier Futures is the newly published annual report of C&M's director of population health.

Available as a <u>video</u> or <u>regular report</u>, it celebrates some of the successful work of our C&M Population Health Partnership from the past year.

The <u>C&M VCFSE Health and Care Leaders Group</u> and transformation programme supports our sector's active involvement in the partnership's work – from the recent situation analysis on child poverty and supporting All Together Smokefree, to early involvement in the housing and health partnership.

You'll also recognise many areas where our VCFSEs are delivering initiatives for the likes of targeted lung health checks that are making a difference to the lives of our communities.

Another recent example of how the sector's working with public health and other partners to benefit our residents is <u>Community in Mind</u>. This is a collaborative film featuring community groups, organisations and charities that are part of the Warrington in Mind alliance. The film was screened at Cineworld Warrington on 15 May to coincide with Mental Health Awareness Week 2025.
