BRIDGE Research Network launched

We're proud to launch BRIDGE Research Network – a brand new, free platform bringing together the VCFSE sector, researchers and health and care professionals across the North West.

Too often, research happens to communities rather than with them but BRIDGE is here to change that. It hopes to create fairer partnerships where lived experience and local knowledge stand alongside academic expertise.

You can join our online launch event on Monday 20 October, from 1pm to 2.30pm, where you can explore the platform, hear from guest speakers and contribute to the future of community-led research.

Last week we teamed up with One Knowsley to give an introduction to the BRIDGE Community: Ethnic Minorities Voices in Research. Together, with The Pheonix Way Network, we explored the initiative and engaged in open, honest conversations about the changes they would like to see in how information is gathered and used.

VOLA's Community Grants programme has officially launched, offering funding for projects that help 18 to 21 year olds who are not in employment, education or training (NEET) to build skills, confidence and brighter futures.

Funded by the UK Government through the Liverpool City Region Combined Authority's Youth Guarantee Trailblazer, as part of the Get Britain Working plan, the programme makes £711,000 available to VCFSE organisations based in the Liverpool City Region.
